Garlic mustard is moving into the Hone Quarry area, threatening special wildflowers. This invasive plant out-competes these native beauties by growing vigorously and poisoning the soil.

Pulling garlic mustard is easy and effective, especially in the spring before it flowers or produces seed.

Please help us remove garlic mustard from several key areas at Hone Quarry. We will divide into four groups (each trained and led by a naturalist), pull for 1-2 hours, and then taste some garlic mustard pesto while we share experiences.
